This year has been crazy. In some ways good crazy, but in a lot of ways not. The global pandemic forced us to put a hold on our in-person events, and has temporarily halted some of our member discounts due to supply chain shortages. The BWA was handed its first lawsuit in our storied 45 year history. Some of our family and friends succumbed to illness, job losses, and other hardships. But the light at the end of the tunnel is getting brighter and brighter, and we accomplished so much and still carried out our mission this year!

• Thanks to the hard work of our incredible NPFF Coordinator Emily Grimes, we successfully transitioned our popular film festival to an international virtual event and raised money to support American Whitewater!

• Our virtual monthly meetings drew some incredible speakers which would never have happened if the events had stayed in person! We had staff members Kevin and Bethany from American Whitewater, world-renowned expedition kayaker Darcy Gaechter, and professional kayaker Katrina Van Wijk pull together some amazing programs for our members!

• On top of the excellent speakers, our virtual monthly programs also included useful tips and resources, like Drysuit Repair 101 by past president Robert Watts and Search & Rescue Lessons Learned by Michael Williams and Sandra Broadus. Plus as always, lots of excellent trip reports and river stories provided by members like you!

• We learned that the low head dam on the Elkhorn by the Jim Beam Old Grandad Distillery is being removed! Although there have been a few delays, the project is still on track to be completed this summer! This will create a safer environment for paddlers and fishermen alike, as well as improve the ecosystem health for wildlife on the Elkhorn, and maybe will provide a new surf wave or two, who knows?

• The BWA swept the Jess Cup paddle race this year, with members Sam latarola and Sarah Leach taking the men's and women's categories.

• Member Bill Lynch won a \$50 gift card to J&H Lanmark Store for filling out our member survey!

• Despite the BWA not holding our own events, our members continued to spread the good word of whitewater and introduced new paddlers to the sport throughout these challenging times, and those paddlers have in turn introduced their friends to the sport! Our membership has continued to grow, despite the temporary setbacks.

• In-person events are back!! We just had our first in-person meeting in May at AW Acres and Bob Larkin grilled hamburgers and hotdogs for attendees. Tons of members and new paddlers showed up, and we're excited to bring them into the fold! We hope to have meetings at Rock House Brewing again once bar and restaurant restrictions are lifted.

• We intend to restart roll sessions sometime in June. Although local pools still have a lot of COVID restrictions, we will at a minimum be hosting rolling sessions on the Elkhorn. Stay tuned for more details to come!

• We will be launching a new (much improved!) website within the next few weeks!

• We will be hosting the Beginner's Clinic the last weekend of August, so mark your calendars! More details to follow on that soon.

I've had a very difficult time coming up with the words to describe this year's NPFF - not because it was a novel year for us, although there is definitely that - but because the NPFF has always been part of my life, and I definitely did not expect to end up with the Director Role this year. I can remember so much about the NPFF - creating artwork for the kids' poster contest back in the day, wrapping my head around meeting William Neely's grieving wife, jealously watching Tyler Bradt hit on my mom, excitedly being featured in a few of my friend's films that were entered. I remember it all. Which is hilarious because this festival is notorious for the opposite. I always knew that I would take on the Director role for NPFF one day - my Dad created it, I'm a sucker for sentiment & no one ever wants to do it, so I knew it would happen - I never imagined it would be this year, in a pivot to virtual.

My journey as budding NPFF Director started in October. COVID-19 was ramping up in Kentucky and we had a horrendous presence in the Whitehouse. I was scared. Things felt really, really bleak. I cried a few times, but mostly I expressed my emotions by lashing out irrationally as I am wont to do. After a weekend paddling at one of my most favorite seasonal runs and witnessing how callous my community was about the virus, then going to work on Monday morning & watching the very real, very grim reality play out in the hospital (my workplace), I felt hopeless. I did as we all did in October - I turned to my phone, and I turned into a doom scroller. Endlessly pulling the page up on my phone for more. I wanted some inspiration. Some way to channel all of this energy. I tried a "campaign" of sorts to collab with my friend on posters that showed paddlers in masks & social distancing, I pitched in on efforts at the hospital, I supported organizations that were doing what I perceived as good. And then it hit me, The NPFF needed to happen, and it needed to happen online. There wasn't going to be a 2021 NPFF, and I just couldn't wrap my head around that. This year was the most perfect year for a virtual pivot. Folks were home, exhausting streaming services, feeling alone, yearning for inspiration. We needed to feel some sort of connection, and more specifically I needed to feel like I was moving forward. I wanted so badly to raise money for rivers above all because at that moment the future of our planet felt very dark to me.

So, I stopped doom scrolling, and started researching.

As I've already stated, 2020 felt like a year of chaos, but was also a time when artists & activists flourished - tragic events turned into new energy and brought about incredible inspiration that manifested in the form of demonstrations, paintings, poems, increased voter turnout, and ... film festivals!! There were several Film Festivals in 2020 that were either created overnight, or pivoted their format overnight. I found this out, and Boom! My fire was extra lit. I asked to take on the Director role in early December, and I was in touch with a few other outdoor/paddling film festivals around Christmastime. I got some great beta on how to pull it off, but knew our standard February timeline was not going to fly. So, I had a look at calendars, thought about strategies to capture the most amount of dirtbags possible, and landed on April 20th! The most Film Fest & Chill Tuesday of 2021.

This year, we opened up our festival to ticketholders for two whole weeks! From April 13th - April 27th, folks were able to view all 2021 submissions on-demand. We gave away door prizes and rolled out guest host clips during our live event on April 20th. I was very excited that this style would bring the NPFF back to its true roots as a film festival - giving us the space to celebrate the filmmakers, and giving ticketholders time to watch the films.

Through our platform shift, I had the unique opportunity to interview several super stars in the whitewater film world; Aniol Serrasolses, Todd Wells, Mikel Sarasola, Paige Swift and Jeff Springer. It was amazing to conduct these interviews, but all had their separate challenges. I used my lunch breaks at the hospital to head up to vacant rooms to Zoom with each of these folks. Aniol was in Chile under a pretty strict COVID lockdown. We tried several times to record his interview - he had to drive into town to get WiFi, but everything was closed due to curfew, so we made his interview happen from the driver's seat of his car outside of a restaurant in town. Todd, Mikel & I navigated 3 time zones while Todd was on his way into work, and Paige & Jeff were absolute heroes - making time for an interview on the back of another stressful event. This year was a complete labor of love – between communication platforms & navigating pandemic motivation levels, it was not easy to rally volunteers. NPFF 2021 would not have been possible without the help of a few select individuals, and most notably, my dad – the OG who started it all. At first, dad was not stoked on the idea. Like everyone else, he thought we'd be reinventing the wheel & it would be more hassle than it was worth – but I kept pushing, and he kept caving until eventually he was my right hand man. I'm incredibly fortunate that my dad is pretty tech savvy and is also 100% retired. Dad spent days on end learning how to stream from Vimeo, create GIFs and in general became a problem solving ninja. In new or tricky situations, it's been my experience that people will repeat phrases to themselves. This year, my dad's phrase was "I swear, this feels just like the first NPFF". We were, in fact, reinventing the wheel. I don't think I would have done it without him, and I definitely don't think he would have done it without me - he also kept repeating "I thought I was retired?"

Thanks to our sponsors, we were able to draw in 141 ticketholders, and we gave away items like a winner's choice Jackson Kayak, Aire Couch, IR schwag, Watershed drybag, MKC course package, and a Custom Alpacka Raft. Sam Morrison, Christin Knight, Tommy Penick, and Larry Meisner all took home gold in their respective categories (for a full results, visit npff.org), and we raised over \$4k which we will turn around and donate to American Whitewater & Nepal River Conservation Trust. For an event that was slated to fall victim to COVID, I'd say this year was a knock it out of the park success! We are making plans to be back in person next year, but will keep a lot of the virtual elements we rolled out this year. Look for a hybrid of sorts for NPFF 2022, comin' back atcha in February! Until then, check out how you can get involved with our Roadshows at npff.org. Thanks so much for your support.
